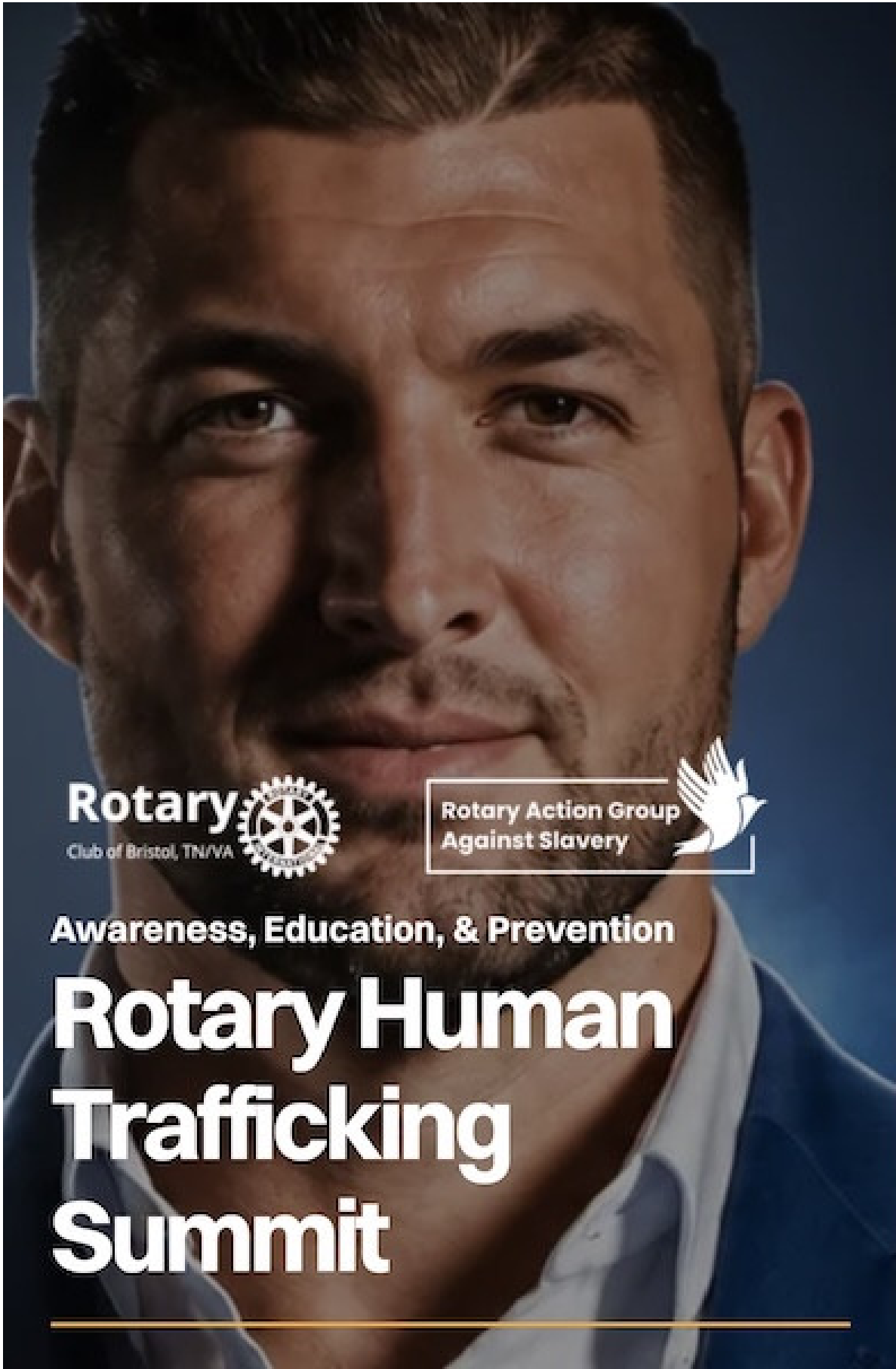

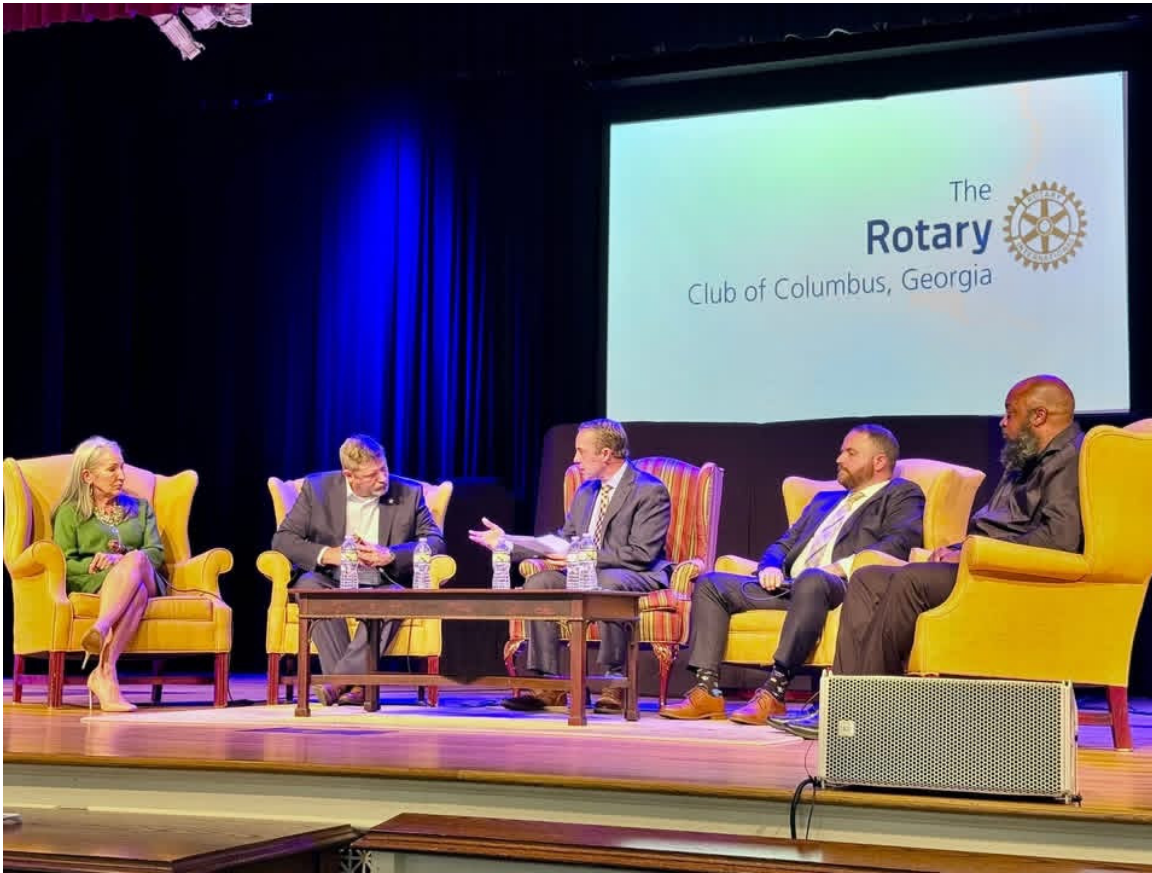
Rotary Human Trafficking Summit
